

LABOR CONDITION APPLICATION (LCA)

NOTICE OF THE FILING OF A LABOR CONDITION APPLICATION WITH THE EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING ADMINISTRATION

1. An H-1B non-immigrant worker is being sought by **Kolstein Music, Inc.** through the filing of a Labor Condition Application (LCA) with the Employment and Training Administration of the U.S. Department of Labor.
2. One (1) such worker is being sought.
3. This worker is being sought as a **Music Instructor in Double Bass** who will perform the following:
 - Plan and prepare lessons in relation to individual students' needs and examination syllabuses;
 - Teach music theory, aural skills and practical techniques to pupils entering and preparing pupils for examinations;
 - Acquire appropriate teaching materials and resources; Motivate pupils and encourage progress;
 - Create and maintain a network of contacts to ensure work continuity;
 - Communicate with academic staff and parents;
 - Ensure up-to-date knowledge and awareness of examination requirements;
 - Assess pupils' abilities, providing feedback and writing reports.
4. An hourly wage of \$26 per hour is being offered. This position is a part-time position, i.e., twenty (20) hours per week. Master's degree in Music is required.
5. The period of employment for which this worker is sought is October 1, 2021 to September 30, 2024.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR POSTING AND FILING:

1. Notice must be posted in at least two conspicuous locations at the site the work will be performed.
2. Notice must be placed prior to filing the Labor Condition Application.
3. Notice must remain posted for at least ten (10) consecutive business days or until a **Music Instructor in Double Bass** applies.
4. Employer must retain copies of the posted notice with notations as to the dates and locations of the posted notices.
5. All posting notice and other information utilized in the processing of a Labor Condition Application must be available for public inspection.

*NOTE: Employer should maintain a separate file containing all related H1B-1 materials for each alien worker.
